From the Pastor

Series on the Mass, Part 27

The wine and water are poured into the chalice at the epistle side of the altar and then the priest, using the purificator, wipes up any drops that may be on the inside of the cup. He then places the chalice on the altar and moves to the center of the altar to offer up the chalice. On arriving at the center, he places the purificator over the paten that is partially under the corporal and, with his right hand, takes the chalice. Elevating it slightly, he offers it up, saying the prayer "Offerimus". This prayer is said with the thought that this wine will become the Blood of Christ that was poured out for us from the cross. The prayer also states that it is being offered for our salvation and that of the whole world. The Church prays especially for her children but also for all men and women who could become her children. After this prayer is said with the chalice elevated, the chalice is placed on the corporal while tracing the sign of the cross and covered with a pall. The sign of the cross is a beautiful way to mark the place where the chalice will be placed while making us think of the same sacrifice which is being made present sacramentally.

Historically, this prayer and the two following ones are found in the Mozarabic missal from the Spanish liturgy of the High Middle-Ages. This ancient liturgy is still being used in a chapel of the cathedral of Toledo, Spain. The pall is a practical solution for keeping insects and dust from landing in the chalice. At one time the far edge of the large corporal was pulled over the chalice for that purpose. Later a starched square piece of linen was used since this was far more practical. If an insect should land in the chalice after the consecration, the priest would either have to consume it or use a pin to lance it and consume it with fire in one of the Mass candles.
