

July 10, 2016 - Eighth Sunday after Pentecost

From the Pastor

Series on the Mass, Part 30

The washing of the hands during the offertory had a very practical origin that also has a deeper spiritual signification. The washing of the hands takes place after the incensation of the altar since the hands of the priest could get some black soot on them from the thurible or dust from the incense boat. Further, it was during the offertory in the Early Church that the priest would receive the various gifts from the faithful, such as food for the support of the clergy. Some of these could also dirty the priest's hands in handling them. Since the priest's hands need to be clean to touch the Body of Christ, he would wash his hands at this point in the offertory. To this practical necessity, part of Psalm 25 was recited which speaks of the innocence that is needed to approach the altar. In our case, it is an innocence that has to be acquired; only our Savior is perfectly innocent and could say: "Who among you could accuse me of sin?" (Jn 8:46). The deeper spiritual meaning here is, of course, that at the moment when the priest acts in persona Christi, (the person of Christ), he has to purify the soul. In the Imitation of Christ, we read "Oh, how clean should be the hands, how pure the mouth, how holy the body and how undefiled the heart of a priest, into whom so often the Author of all purity enters." (Imitation, Bk 4; Chap 11; Para 6) We must all strive after this purity if we are to receive communion frequently, so let us make the priest's washing of the hands an occasion for us to purify our souls with renewed contrition.
