

August 7, 2016 - Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost

From the Pastor

Series on the Mass, Part 34

The Offertory continued: The Secret Prayer. This is the second of three proper prayers of the Mass which change according to the day and feast. The first was the Collect and the final one is the Post Communion. The Collect and Post Communion are preceded by the *Dominus Vobiscum* and the word "oremus"; however, for the Secret, the "Orate Fratres" fulfills this role. The Secret prayers usually make allusion to the offerings of the bread and wine that are on the altar in preparation for the consecration, where they will become the Body and Blood of our Savior. The origin of calling this prayer the "secret" is disputed. It could be from the fact that it is said silently so only the ministers at the altar can hear it. It could also originate from the Latin sense of the word "secretum" in which it could refer to the offerings that have been set aside and reserved for the sacrifice as opposed to the other offerings destined to be used by the poor and clergy. Another possibility is that it is the prayer before the *Secreta*; that is, before the sacred mystery that is about to take place on the altar at the consecration.

The concluding doxology of the prayer is said silently except for the final words of the last secret prayer, if there is more than one, since the priest uses these final words to introduce the Preface. Before saying the "Per Omnia saecula saeculorum" out loud, the priest or the Master of Ceremonies turns the pages of the missal to the Preface, and the priest, placing his hands flat on the altar, sings out loud the last part of the prayer. All respond "Amen".
