

# October 16, 2016- 22nd Sunday after Pentecost

## From the Pastor

### *Series on the Mass, Part 44*

*The Canon: Hanc Igitur.* At the *Hanc Igitur* prayer, the priest extends his hands over the gifts to point very clearly to what is being offered. It is also symbolic of the imposition of the hands in the Old Testament when the high priest would place his hands over the victim of sacrifice. Here in the Sacrifice of the New Testament, the priest points to the unblemished victim, Christ, Who substitutes Himself for us. We pray that God accept this sacrifice because we are imperfectly participating in it. God accepts the perfect sacrifice of His Son, but our union to it is where we need to keep purifying ourselves by our own daily prayers and sacrifices.

When the prayer mentions “we Thy servants,” it is referring to the priests and clergy, who are to be the servants of the Church, faithful and clergy. Our Lord at the Last Supper washed the feet of the disciples to show them how they ought to serve one another; likewise, the clergy are also to serve the faithful. The Holy Father will call himself the “servants of the servants of God” since, being chosen to be Christ’s Vicar here on earth, he is all the more the servant of the whole Church. This prayer also refers to the whole Church as “Thy whole family” because, through baptism, we are all part of the Church and children of God.

We pray that our days may be ordered in peace and that we may have salvation and be numbered among the chosen ones. This is the fruit of the Mass: that we may have the peace of Christ in our hearts and that we obtain eternal life. This prayer dates back to Gregory the Great, who added the prayer for peace during a siege of Rome. Since that time, the Church has kept the prayer as we are constantly being held siege by the devil, the world, and our own disordered passions. During the octave of Easter and at Pentecost, there is also the mention of the newly baptized, who have been brought to the waters of baptism and have received the forgiveness of their sins and a new birth in the Holy Spirit.
