

# Dec. 11, 2016 - Third Sunday of Advent

## From the Pastor

### *Series on the Mass, Part 50*

*The Canon: The Consecration of the Chalice.* "For this is the chalice of my Blood" – these are the essential words of the consecration of the chalice. To these are joined: "of the new and eternal Testament." This New and Eternal Testament was established on Calvary between God and all men by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. This New Testament replaces the Old Testament between God and Israel, which was established by Moses when he received the tablets of the Law on Mount Sinai. The Old Testament was good, but it was imperfect, and it prefigured the New Testament, which was to come.

We then use the words "Mystery of Faith". These words refer to the Eucharist, which is the great Mystery of our Faith and which summarizes and contains all the others. We have in it the Trinity, since where one person of the Holy Trinity acts, all three persons of the Holy Trinity are also present. The Incarnation is set before us, in that, it is through His becoming man that Christ makes Himself present on the altar to suffer and die for our Salvation. Our Redemption is present since the sacrifice of Calvary is made present once again. When our Lord announced this Mystery for the first time after the multiplication of the loaves, many of the disciples left Him, but the apostles remained faithful, even though they did not understand. St. Peter said: "Lord, to whom shall we go? Thou hast the words of eternal life." (John 6:68) We will never fully understand the Mystery of the Eucharist, but our Faith in it is the mark of a Catholic.

Then come the words "which shall be shed for you and for many unto the remission of sins." On Calvary, our Lord shed His Blood for us so that our sins and those of all men may be forgiven. But it is up to each one of us to make this objective redemption that our Lord won for us our personal redemption. This is where many will not make the effort to be converted and live. Any sin can be forgiven because of the infinite graces and merits won for us by our Savior, but not everyone is going to humble himself and ask for that forgiveness; hence, the word "many" is used instead of "all".

Finally after the words of consecration, the priest says, as he genuflects: "As often as you shall do these things, you shall do them in memory of Me." It is because of this command that the Church celebrates daily the Sacrifice of the Mass for over two thousand years. This is also the passage as defined by the Council of Trent where our Lord establishes the sacrament of Holy Orders.
