# From the Pastor

## Quasimodo Sunday

Today's Sunday has a number of different names, including most recently, Mercy Sunday due to the devotion to the image of the Divine Mercy from St. Faustina. It is also called Quasimodo Sunday from the first words of the Introit. In the Early Church, there was the custom of having the neophytes wear the white garments for the whole week, starting from their baptism which they received during the Easter Vigil all the way to the Saturday of Easter, when they would put white garments aside. That Saturday was called Sabbatum in Albis Deponendis, the Saturday when the white garments were set aside. This Sunday would then be called Dominica in Albis Depositis from the fact that it is the first day the neophytes have put aside their white garments. Today is also called Low Sunday as opposed to Easter Sunday, for it is the octave of High Sunday, the great day we celebrate the Resurrection. There are also references to today being the Pascha Clausum, that is, "Easter being closed," since today is the octave day that closes Easter Week. We come across these different names in literature concerning the Easter liturgy.

The Mass today is centered around Faith in Christ, the faith which has overcome the world, as St. John tells us in the Epistle. Our Lord took our sins upon Himself and died on the Cross, so we could be freed from sin and rise also with Him. We also see our faith confirmed through the faith of the Apostles, and particularly by the act of faith Doubting Thomas makes in the Gospel today: "My Lord and my God." St. Thomas' faith was strengthened by seeing the risen Lord and placing his finger in the wounds in His hands and placing his hand in the open wound in our Lord's side. St. Thomas doubted, so our doubt could be removed, hence our Lord says, "blessed are they that have not seen, and have believed." Let us renew our faith and trust in our Lord, so we can have life in His name.
