From the Pastor

Series on the Mass, Part 35

Preface Introductory Dialogue. The dialogue of the preface is found in all the liturgies of the East and West since the 2nd or 3rd centuries. The first versicle and response of the dialogue is the conclusion of the secret prayer. Then comes the *Dominus vobiscum*, which the priest says without turning to the faithful as he generally does during the other parts of the Mass. His attention is now focused on the sacrifice that will be accomplished, and his hands are on the altar, which represents Christ. At the *Sursum corda* ("lift up your hearts"), the priest begins the motion of raising his hands, which symbolizes the leaving of the things of this world for those of heaven. In some places, this is also the time when the faithful stand for the preface, particularly with the response *Habemus ad Dominum* ("we have lifted them up to the Lord"). The motion of the priest's hands continues with the next versicle, *Gratias agamus Domino Deo nostro* ("Let us give thanks to the Lord our God"), which motion symbolizes the bringing together all the prayers and petitions of the faithful and of the priest and presenting them to God. This versicle also shows the theme of the Mass, namely that of thanksgiving. The word Eucharist, often used for the Mass or communion, comes from the Greek word *ευχαριστία*, which means thanksgiving. The priest also bows his head when he says *Deo nostro*, thereby showing adoration to God. The faithful respond: *Dignum et justum est* ("It is meet and right to do so"). This dialogue has a certain pressing nature to it, for we are entering into the most sacred act of our Faith, the sacramental re-presenting once again of the one sacrifice of our Savior.
