From the Pastor

Series on the Mass, Part 36

The Preface of the Mass can vary according to the liturgical season or the feast day; however, all the Prefaces have the end of giving thanks to Almighty God. There are fifteen different Prefaces for the Universal Church that bring out a particular aspect of a feast or liturgical season. Where there is no particular Preface that applies to a Mass, then the Common Preface is used, which simply presents more universal reasons for adoring God, such as His existence and infinite perfection.

The Council of Trent reduced the number of Prefaces from the great number that was being used everywhere and limited it to the few in the Missal. Other proper Prefaces were approved for use in particular dioceses, such as the Preface for Advent, Corpus Christi, St. John the Baptist, the Dedication of a Church, and patron saints for religious orders. At High Masses, the Preface is sung. These melodies are very ancient and quite beautiful.

The priest recites or sings the Preface with his arms held out at least shoulder width apart. At one time, the arms were held out stretched like Christ on the Cross, and certain religious orders still do this. The Preface is the beginning of the Canon where the sacrifice of the Cross is made present sacramentally, and so even the posture of the priest pointed to what he was silently praying at the altar. I suspect that the bringing in of the arms to shoulder width was the result of the heavier vestments that developed in later centuries and the advanced age of pontiffs at times, making the full arms extension for the length of the Canon too difficult. For the sake of uniformity in the celebration of Mass, the shoulder width position of the arms was mandated.
