

# Oct. 2, 2016 - External Solemnity of Our Lady of the Rosary

## From the Pastor

### *Series on the Mass, Part 42*

“Remember, Lord, Thy servants and handmaids NN, and all here present whose faith and devotion are known to Thee.” This prayer, the Memento for the Living, has the priest remember particularly those who requested the Mass to be celebrated, those assisting at the Mass, and those who are dear to them. While reciting this first part of the prayer, the priest brings his hands together in a circular motion. After pausing to pray quietly for those whom he wishes, he extends his hands once again and continues the prayer. This motion of the hands symbolizes the gathering of all the intentions of the faithful present. We are all in need of prayers, and so assisting at Mass, which is the most powerful prayer there is, and being remembered in a particular way by the priest in the Canon of the Mass should be especially important to us, such that we try to assist at Mass as often as possible.

We have to keep working on deepening our faith and devotion, and this is going to take effort on our part. If we just go about our week like the rest of men and only pray on Sunday morning for a while, it is difficult to see how our faith is going to grow. Our faith and devotion are known to God, but if we really live our Faith, it will be seen by others, who in turn might want to imitate us.

The prayer continues and mentions how this sacrifice of praise is being offered for all present and those dear to them, particularly for the redeeming of their souls, but also for other things if they are truly good for the person. We easily ask for the things that we think are good for us, but God knows what is truly good. Therefore when we ask for something, we should keep as a condition in our prayers “Thy will be done.”

The letters “N&N” are a vestige of the tablet upon which the deacon had written the names of those who had been recommended to the Lord and he would read them at this point in the Mass. This prayer is very ancient and we can find a mention of it in a letter of Pope Innocent I written in 416 AD .
