## From the Pastor

#### Series on the Mass, Part 47

The Canon: Consecration. At the words of consecration, our Lord becomes truly present on the altar. At the Last Supper on Holy Thursday evening, Jesus anticipated in a sacramental fashion the sacrifice that He was to offer the next day on the Cross. At Mass, Jesus, by the hands of the priest, makes this one same sacrifice present on the altar once again. The Mass truly is a sacrifice. With the separate consecration of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of our Lord, we have the sacramental – i.e., by means of signs – separation of the Body and Blood of our Savior. When we separate the Blood from the Body, we have death. Thus, by means of signs, we have the separation of the Body and Blood on the altar, and we have the sacramental making present once again of the Sacrifice of Christ.

On the altar, Christ is truly present and always offers Himself to the Father, as He truly offered Himself at Calvary. He no longer suffers with His natural Body when Mass is celebrated, but His glorious Body, which suffered for us, still carries the marks of His crucifixion and Passion. That same love that inspired Him to offer Himself on the Cross continues to be the motive for His sacrifice at each Mass, where the same sacrifice is made present in an unbloody fashion. Our Lord does continue to suffer, however, in His Mystical Body, the Church.

#### St. Pius X said:

The Sacrifice of the Mass is substantially the same sacrifice of the Cross in that in both the one and the other Jesus Christ is the priest and victim. They differ, however, in the manner in which they are offered. On the Cross, Jesus Christ is offered by pouring out His Blood and meriting for us; while on the altar, He sacrifices Himself without the effusion of blood and He applies the fruits of His Passion and death.

### We're Listening

We appreciate the enthusiasm and kindness everyone is showing while we work on the building and begin establishing full parish operations. As we settle in, parish life can be developed more fully and policies set that will make planning activities a smoother process. Starting the week of November 27, the building will be open during office hours, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Mondays and Fridays, as well as 30 minutes before each Mass. More hours will be added soon.

We are on a tight budget, trying to conserve funds for needed expansion and to retire debt, while also covering the yet unestablished operating costs. Several FSSP apostolates have families and individuals that volunteer to clean the facilities, including restrooms, and we would like to implement a similar program (see the volunteer section below). The Altar Society, once established, will be responsible for the sanctuary and sacristy areas.

Some concerns have been raised concerning the Sunday Masses and CCD, which we are trying to address. The Parish Council will meet in early December to discuss these concerns and possible solutions. Please be patient with us in the interim. We welcome your constructive comments on this and any other subject.
