From the Pastor

30th Anniversary of the FSSP, Conclusion

The primary intentions of the Fraternity Founders as stated in their letter July of 1988 was to remain Catholic. The Church offered the Society of St. Pius X a generous and truly maternal proposition on May 5th, 1988, which would have reconciled the Society, but these were rejected and subsequently offered to the new society, the FSSP. The Founders of the FSSP pointed out that their vocation was to dedicate themselves to the People of God and above all to the formation of future priests in an authentic Catholic spirit. This venerable tradition of the Catholic Church involves the celebration of the Divine worship according to the guidelines of immemorial tradition. The sanctification of a priest is worked out by his acting as a priest fulfilling his vocation by serving the faithful entrusted to him. The priest prays for you and offers sacrifice and you should pray for him.

A beautiful way to take part in the prayers and works of the FSSP is to join the Confraternity of St. Peter. This Confraternity supports the priests of the FSSP by their prayers and sacrifices. Members commit themselves to say daily 1) one decade of the Rosary for the sanctification of the priests and more priestly vocations, 2) to recite the Confraternity prayer and 3) once a year to have a Mass offered for the priests of the FSSP. Simple, but very beneficial for the FSSP. Please consider becoming a member.
