

Reverend Daniel Alloy, FSSP

Fr. Daniel Alloy, FSSP joined Regina Caeli Parish in July of 2022. He hails from Nebraska, where his immediate family members still reside. He received the majority of his priestly formation at Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary, also in Nebraska. In 2018-2019, he served a pastoral year at Casa Cristo Rey, the FSSP house in Guadalajara, Mexico. Ordained June 1, 2020 for the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter, his first assignment was St. Stephen of Hungary parish in Allentown, Pennsylvania. Father worked there for two years as parochial vicar under Fr. Gregory Pendergraft, FSSP.

Fr. Alloy comes from a family of teachers. He has taught catechism, Sacred Scripture, British literature, and music to a variety of ages. He also practices a variety of sports, soccer being chief among them.

The priesthood is an unfathomable blessing for a man called to it. Just as the Eucharist is the summit of the Christian life, the Mass is the pinnacle of a priest's life. From the fount of the altar, graces flow into the various duties of a priest's life: confessions, sick calls, baptisms, sermons, and the teaching of the Faith. Fr.
